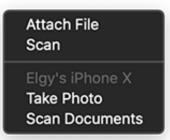
In QuickBooks Desktop Mac, we call all of these kinds of files attachments or documents.

To add an attachment

- 1. Open the transaction window (Invoices, Enter Bills...whatever you need) or record center (Customer Center or Vendor Center, that is).
- 2. Click at the top right corner of the window. The Attachments window appears.



- 3. Click at the bottom left corner of the Attachments window.
- 4. Choose an attachment method:
 - Attach File
 - Scan
 - [your iPhone or iPad]
 - Take Photo
 - Scan Documents



- 5. If you choose Attach File:

That's it--you've attached a file to your transaction or record.

Important: QuickBooks doesn't move your attached files from their original folder. Instead, it makes a copy of the attached file and puts it into the Attached Documents Library you chose in the Attachments Preferences.
